Insurance Mandate Exceptions

- Experimental fertility care services, monetary payments to gestational carriers or surrogates, or the reversal of voluntary sterilization undergone after the covered individual successfully procreated with the covered individual's partner are not covered
- · Does not require religious organizations to provide coverage
- Employers who self-insure or who have fewer than 50 employees are exempt from the requirements of the law
- Employers who self-insure are exempt from the requirements of the law

How was each state's grade determined?

The following criteria was reviewed and scored to identify a final grade of A through F:

- Number of volunteer run, peer led RESOLVE support groups in state (as of January 1, 2020)
- Number of physicians specializing in reproductive endocrinology at SART-accredited fertility clinics
- Number of women in state who have experienced physical difficulty in getting pregnant or carrying a

- Insurance mandate information in each state evaluated against the RESOLVE Model Insurance Benefit which has been vetted and approved by physicians, attorneys, and patient advocates
